<p>L.Marchese</p>	<p>On September 19th, Métis communities throughout the provinces and territories celebrate the recognition of Métis rights, known as Powley Day. Métis rights remained largely unrecognized until September 19, 2003, when the Supreme Court of Canada unanimously affirmed the existence and protection of Métis rights in R. v. Powley. While hunting in October 1993, Steve and Roddy Powley killed a bull moose near Sault Ste Marie, Ontario. Although the Powley's tagged their catch with their Métis card, Conservation Officers later charged them for hunting moose without a license and unlawful possession. The conviction prompted a decade- long legal battle. In 2003 the Supreme Court declared that, as members of the Sault Ste. Marie Métis community, the Powleys had the ancestral right to harvest for food — a right protected under section 35 of The Constitution Act. It was the first court decision to recognize Métis rights as similar to those of First Nations and Inuit Peoples of Canada. We invite the Denis Morris community to take the time to reflect and learn about Métis history, and what Steve and Roddy Powley courageous action means for the Métis.
